
ENGINEERS WITHOUT BORDERS - USA - PORTLAND CHAPTER

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATING NEW PROJECTS

The Chapter Projects Committee will evaluate the information in this form according to the following criteria, and then make a recommendation to the Steering Committee to apply to EWB-USA for the project or to table it until that time when the project needs can be better met by current chapter resources.

Current Chapter Resources

Does the project require additional human resources?

Does the project act bring new members to the Portland Chapter?

Is this project a continuation of a project already begun by the Chapter?

Does the Chapter have members of the appropriate disciplines available to work on the project?

Scope of Project

Is the technical complexity of the project within the scope of current members' expertise?

Does the timing of the project segue well with other current projects?

The Project Team (PT)

How well are the technical requirements of the project met by the team members' areas of practice?

What is the level of commitment of the PT and the PT Leader?

Host Community (HC)

Has EWB-USA or the Chapter worked with the HC in the past?

Did the team approach the HC or did the HC request assistance?

What is the strength of the connection to the people in the HC?

What is the strength of the local NGO (how is their track record for accomplishments)?

What is the feasibility of working in the HC (how close/far, safety from disease/violence)?

What is the potential for establishing a long-term partnership with the HC?

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
